#### Wimborne Drama 1998 - 1999 SEASON

This time last year we were looking back on a difficult year of ever rising prices and dwindling audiences.

We had much discussion as to what could be done to (a) raise money to finance our productions and (b) how to court a larger audience to come and support us.

We decided to seek wider financial support, but more importantly, we asked you, the audience what type of plays you wanted to come and see. As a result of this we have had a varied year: firstly last Autumn we staged a

simple, basic comedy - Fur Coat And No Knickers - and, despite fears that it wouldn't go down very well; it was just too silly; it was too dated; etc. etc. etc. we were delighted at the laughter which greeted our opening performance and continued for the entire run. The play made a profit and we were heartened by a good audience response at the start of the season. Earlier this year we had another comedy, although Lord Arthur Savile's Crime was a comedy from an entirely different stable. Oscar Wilde's touch was indelibly written on this adaptation of his short story.

Once again our audiences loved it.

#### .... THE BLACK DEATH

disappearing from the map altogether. Indeed, Wimborne Minster's population was slashed by 20% in 1638 when over 400 of her inhabitants died in one particular outbreak. There are many other accounts of how the plague visited and dessimated many other towns, villages and settlements in the county at the time, but what made the occurence in Eyam particularly noteworthy is how the villagers, under the guidance of the rector, William Mompesson and his predecessor

Thomas Stanley chose to contain the plague within the village.

It is recorded that, in 1665, Mary Cooper, a widow, lived in the village with her two young sons and that she took in a journeyman tailor. George Viccars as a lodger. Tradition has it that a box of materials 'relating to his trade' were delivered. The box contained fashionable second hand clothing from London, some of it possibly taken from the bodies of plague victims. On arrival the contents were found to be damp and were therefore laid out in front of the fire to be dried off. Once the fleas were released from the cloth they would move out in search of nourishment. Though they would normally feed on the blood of the rat, they would also take food from other sources - so it was that George Viccars was infected. He became ill shortly afterwards and his funeral is recorded in the parish records as having taken place on 7th September 1665.

The only record of Viccars' passing was that entry in the parish register - as an outsider he had no-one to pay for a headstone or any other tangible testimony to his passing. The 350 inhabitants of the village who witnessed his death were innocently unaware that over the next fifteen months 260 of them would follow.

To cure, after bleeding fifty or sixty ounces, drink very largely of water sharpened with spirit of Vitriol; or, a draft of Brine as soon as seized; sweat in bed, take not other drinks for some hours; or, Use lemon juice largely with every thing.

To prevent, infuse Rue, Sage Mint, Rosemary, Wormwood; of each a handful, in two quarts of the sharpest vinegar, over warm embers for eight days. Then strain through a flannel and add half an ounce of Camphire, dissolved in three ounces of rectified spirit of wine. With this wash the loins, face and mouth, and sniff a little up the nose when you go abroad & smell to a sponge dipt therein when you approach infected persons or places.

As you walk around the village you are constantly reminded of this as many of the headstones are still standing. The graves of Mrs Hancocks family, for example,



are set in a stone walled enclosure on a hillside just outside the current village boundary. In just seven days Mary Hancock buried her husband and each of her six children.

People living across the valley at Stoney
Middleton are said to have watched Mrs
Hancock as she single handedly dug the graves
prior to dragging the bodies from her home,
across the field, where she was the sole
mourner as she laid them to rest.

In 1666, the date of the play, and for many years before England had been divided by Civil Wars - a time when whole villages and even families had been at odds with one another.

Eyam, like many other parishes had, for the past thirty years or so, gone through particularly troubled times.

Two rectors, Shoreland Adams and Thomas Stanley had served the parish for thirty four years. Adams had been appointed in 1630, but was ejected in 1644 when the Puritans came to prominence. He was replaced by Thomas Stanley who was rector for sixteen years until 1660 when Adams was reappointed as rector when the Royalists once again gained control. It is perhaps important to remember that Thomas Stanley looked after the spiritual needs of the villagers throughout the turbulent period covering the Civil Wars and that it was him these often uneducated people looked to for guidance and advice on all matters. He was, in short, a figure who they looked up to and depended on in very difficult times. When Reverend Mompesson arrived on the scene he had a number of seemingly difficult problems of his own to face up to. Firstly he was a stranger, a newcomer straight out of university in what he saw as a cultural backwater. It was almost as if he saw his initial task as a kind of missionary, taming the savages. At the beginning of the play he says to his patron, Sir George Saville that ".... in Eyam I shall lay the first foundation of God's house, I won't begin by making concessions to the material" at which Saville laughs in order ".... to bring you back to earth my boy. You won't see anything looking down from your pedestal". He later asks Catherine, his





fact that he and the ever present Stanley had totally opposing religious beliefs, differing viewpoints which had made them sworn enemies long before the two of them ever met each other in the late Summer of 1665, differences which would be virtually impossible to put aside, but would certainly need to be if they were to find a solution to the overwhelming problems that were soon to face the entire village.




