

### CAST:

PAM FELTHAM: She feels she's not at all like Emily, the part she is playing, therefor it is a great challenge for her. It's a wonderful character part. Emily is very 'Butch', bossy and ill-mannered. She decides the way she's going to behave and nobody dare get in her way. Rehearsals have been great fun and she hopes you enjoy the end result.

CAROLINE HARRISON: This is Caroline's first appearance with Wimbowne Drama Club for a year, and she now tries her hand at playing a nurse. Will anyone employ her after this?!

BARBARA HURST: Only a small part this time, but I hope an interesting one for the audience. I have now started up a drama club for youngsters in Colehill... called 'Dramascene'. HOWARD LOVEJOY: I joined the Club in 1989 and have enjoyed the opportunity of playing a variety of roles. If I had had any assirations to play in works of the Bard, this present part should bring them to a timely end.

MARGARET POPE: Has appeard in eleven three-act plays with the Club, and various one-acts entered in Festivala etc., also in a number of Summer Charity shows.

A few years ago she very much enjoyed playing the part of Diana Standfield in 'Martyred Wives'. The play was concerned with the plight of the wives of the Tolpuddle martyss, and in this she had the opportunity to use the form of speech she heard all around her as a child growing up in the Dorset Farming community. The real Dorset accent, now alas, seldom heard.
