#### Players' Notes

Jeremy Austin has appeared in two of our Tivoli productions over the past twelve months: he played Detective Sergeant Troughton in Run For Your Wife and Samuel Pepys in And So To Bed. With other drama groups he has appeared as Fred in Semi Detached, Editor in Our Town and Gosforth in Gosforth's Fete.

Geoff Whipp has appeared in many plays including Lord Arthur Savile in Lord Arthur Savile's Crime, Hugo and Frederick in Ring Round the Moon, as well as several pantomimes. He was voted HTV's 'Actor of the Year' in 1990 for his portraval of Gosforth in Gosforth's Fete. More recently he has appeared in Shakespearian productions (Demetrius in A Midsummer Night's Dream, Gratiano in The Merchant of Venice and Berowne in Love's Labour's Lost) and had a small supporting role in Emma, due to be screened on television next month. Geoff will direct Wimborne Drama's March 1997 production, the comedy An Evening with Gary Lineker.

Richard Neal returns to an acting role having directed our most recent production, Woman in Mind. His previous roles with Wimborne Drama include Malcolm in Bedroom Farce, Dennis in One For The Road, Charles II in And So To Bed and John Smith in Run For Your Wife. With his former drama groups he has appeared in a number of plays, including Alphabetical Order, Outside Edge and The Real Thing.

Rebecca Gunnell was last seen as Lucy in Woman in Mind and previously as Mary Smith in Ray Cooney's Run For Your Wife. She has acted and sung in musicals and opera, including Magic Flute, The Gondoliers and Dido and Aeneas. At college she wrote the music for an adaptation of Cinderella.

Val Mantle makes her debut for Wimborne Drama, but her face will be familiar to followers of Broadstone Players and Ferndown Drama Group for whom she has made many appearances since 1968, including Renee in the female version of *The Odd Couple*, Mrs Finney in *The Mating Game*, Marion in Absurd Person Singular, Sybil in Private Lives, Sister Laura in Abelard & Heloise and Jane in Nude with Violin.

Margaret Pope last appeared on the Tivoli stage as Julia in And So To Bed. She has acted many roles for Wimborne Drama, including Scrooge in The Farndale Avenue Housing Estate Townswomen's Guild Dramatic Society's Production of A Christmas Carol, Miss Mitchum-Browne in The Secret Tent and a cockney woman in Frost on the Rose.

Barry Baynton (Director) played Bill in Woman in Mind. Previously he was seen as Detective Sergeant Porterhouse in Run For Your Wife and Earnest in Bedroom Farce. Barry's acting credits with other groups in London and Bournemouth include Absurd Person Singular, Ten Times Table, An Inspector Calls and Lord Arthur Savile's Crime. This is the first play Barry has directed for Wimborne Drama.

Nick Watkins (Lighting Director) joined the Club 1992 and has been involved in lighting the twelve or so shows performed since then. In 1994 Nick started helping at the Tivoli, and is now heavily involved in nearly every show there -- which will total nearly 70 this year. These have included Chris Barber, Val Doonican, Bradley Walsh, Barry Cryer and Willie Rushton, Carmen, and Liberty Mountain Elvis. He also has his own small lighting rig which he tours under 'SPOT Lighting' and has been involved in most of the Wimborne Arts Festival shows this year. He has also lit a number of performances at his school, QE. Nick is now 16 and has just started studying for his A-levels.

#### **Director's Notes**

When I was a young lad and a member of 'No Girls Allowed in Our Gang', a task fulfilled was rewarded by a turn on someone's roller skates.

If I am honest, I suppose it is nearly forty years on from those days, and as part of the task tonight I will ask you to play a role in a play I have long wanted to be associated with.

My colleagues breathed heavily when I made it clear the play could be staged. Certainly Wimborne Drama is fortunate to have the Tivoli as home base, room enough with the midtouring size stage. The first reading produced much laughter, so I guess the cause of increased pulses was the thought of over twenty young performers spending almost the entire performance on stage without fidgeting! 'But from where will you get them all?' they thought.

I needed a school where blazers are used, so I am very grateful to the Headmaster of Poole Grammar for allowing the school's uniform to become that of Albion House.

The boys themselves have been recruited from Poole Grammar, Queen Elizabeth's, Corfe Hills, Ashdown, Allenbourn and St Michael's — and everyone gets along just fine!

I said earlier you will take part in the play. You are the parents and friends of Albion House School. Forty Years On has a very complicated structure due to the way it developed: a play within a play...within a play. It is seldom performed because of this, and also because it employs such a large cast. Wimborne Drama is eternally grateful to the young performers who have given so much of their time to to be in the play. We

quite literally could not have done it without them.

Give us a go on your roller skates!

THE first London performance of Forty Years On was given on 31st October 1968 at the Apollo Theatre. John Gielgud, Paul Eddington, Dorothy Reynolds, Nora Nicholson and the author himself were in the cast.

Bennett says that one way to look at Forty Years On is "as an elaborate life-support system for the preservation of bad jokes". Bennett likes bad jokes, and also what might at the time, or even now, have been regarded as slightly off-colour ones. Fortunately Forty Years On was one of the plays on the desk of the Lord Chamberlain when the powers of that office expired in 1968 and stage censorship was abolished. Any 'bad taste' in the script remains gloriously intact.

Hugh and Moggie, the upper-class couple who sit out the Second World War in the basement of Claridge's, were invented as a device by which to string together a series of parodies which Bennett had written separately and stockpiled for possible use in a review. They were the right age and social set to have memories of Lawrence of Arabia, Oscar Wilde and Bloomsbury, but this made the whole exercise -- in Bennett's view -- rather snobbish. By putting their reminiscences into the framework of a school play, he defused the problem, as in this context the class attitudes of Hugh, Moggie and Nursie are simultaneously celebrated and mildly lampooned. Of course, in order to have a school play, one must have a school, and Albion House itself becomes a metaphor for England in decline.
